What is the 2025 Challenge?

While supplies last, Oregonians who sign up and request seeds will be mailed seeds free of charge:

- *Households:* sunflowers, lettuce and pea pods for growing microgreens, encouraging pollinators in your garden, and growing with Oregon farmer-grown seeds!
- *Teachers (pre-K through high school):* a Classroom Seed-Starting Kit with supplies for up to 30 students, and Oregon seeds including lettuce, sunflowers and summer squash
- **Programs and groups working with children and teens:** a Mini Seed-Starting Kit with supplies for starting seeds with up to 15 children or teens

Anyone can join using their own seeds! Garden videos, tips and how-to handouts are posted on the Food Hero <u>Facebook</u> page and added to the Food Hero garden tips website page (<u>foodhero.org/garden-tips</u>).

Once a month, Oregon State University garden, nutrition and bee experts will email participants a

fun letter with new, simple ideas for growing; tips on harvesting, seed-starting, seed-saving and pollinators; recipes; and more.
