


Solitary Bees Leafcutter Bees Genus: Megachile





(pronounced me-ga-KY-lee)



Leafcutter bees are pollinators of alfalfa and many wild plants. They are called leafcutter

bees because they cut out small pieces of leaves to use to build their nests. Leafcutter bees are darkly colored, small to medium-sized bees. In Oregon, they are important pollinators of alfalfa grown for seed. Farmers buy the seed to grow alfalfa plants, which are fed to cows and other livestock (animals raised on a farm) that give us milk, cheese, yogurt, eggs, meat and more.
