

## Solitary Bees Alkali Bees Genus: Nomia (pronounced NO-mi-a)







Alkali bees, like leafcutter bees, pollinate alfalfa flowers to make alfalfa seed. From the seed, farmers grow hay to feed many different types of

animals. Even chickens like alfalfa hay! Alkali bees nest in the ground and are very picky; in the wild they love salty, moist and crumbly soil. Some farmers have figured out how to create these same conditions in the soil on their farms. At these sites, thousands of females build nests side-by-side, packing their nests with alfalfa pollen. After the females lay an egg, the hungry alkali bee larvae consume the pollen and complete their development underground.
